GAMING

- The other expenditure during the period was for the first field trip reimbursement of \$222.99 for Division 1 & 2.

C. Traffic concerns



WHY DOES PAC FUNDRAISE AND WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO?

Fundraising efforts are primarily to benefit the school and support teachers by providing classroom funding (\$200/FTE), and year end staff recognition. In prior years, funds raised fulfilled the Teachers' Wish List (i.e. guitars for music class, uniforms for sports teams), and upgraded the outdoor space with rock benches and the art mural. It takes a village, the more hands on the deck, the more we can offer the students, teachers, staff and the community!



Green bar – Net revenues raised to date = \$5,281! Thank you!

Yellow bar – Expected net revenues by end of school year = \$6,551 or in other words, expecting an additional \$1,270.

Red bar – Budgeted spend = \$7,171 (\$6,920 of it is classroom funds, coaching recognition, YE staff appreciation lunch, small gift for teachers leaving school).

If we are on target with fundraising in the next few months, we will still have a shortfall of \$620 in order to cover the budgeted expenses. The account does have a rainy-day reserve currently invested in a GIC.
