- Total: \$14,473 (\$6,468 raised + \$8,005 retained earnings; not including Earthquake or GIC)
- Spent: \$7,016
- Classroom Funds (\$200 per FTE used for extra holiday items and digital memberships that enhance learning) - 70%
- Staff Appreciation & Goodbye Gifts for Staff 16%
- Admin (membership fee, software license, supplies) 11%
- School Community Events 3%

- Spent: \$14,873
